CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Hello and welcome to the eighth edition of our annual club newsletter. It is great to head into Christmas and the New Year with our adult men's team once again Junior Football Champions and looking forward to a Connacht Junior Football final in January against Sligo champions, St. Patricks GAA, Dromard.

The 2021 season began as 2020 left off with the country in a Covid-19 lockdown. It was not until the end of April that we were allowed back to grounds and our beloved games. After an initial period of training in pods, the go-ahead was given for competitive football to begin. It has been a busy and exciting season since with a full and tight schedule of training and games. We embraced a new way of registration with the launch of the Foireann membership registration system and in September we saw the introduction of online ticketing for Championship games. Both welcome developments as they will help take the burden of administration from club officers.

It was great when we did get to the football field. We had fifty adult men at training and with these numbers there was plenty of football for everyone. We competed in the Kelly cup, Cusack cup, the Michael Walsh League, the West Mayo B JFC, the County Junior C championship and the Mayo league where we were again able to enter a second adult team, with teams in Division 3 and Division 6.

I would like to congratulate the players and management and say well done to all involved - just rewards for the work put in over the last number of years. It is important to acknowledge the management team of John Reilly, Peter Carney, John Doherty and Eoin Sweeney who have put in countless hours of meetings, video analysis, planning, preparation, travel and sleepless nights to make sure that the team were prepared and ready. These men put in as much work as professional and inter-county coaches. Thank you to Michael Ryan, the team kit man who deserves credit and praise for the way he looks after the team jerseys. This clearly shows every time the team takes to the field. Everything from here on is a bonus but I passionately believe that there is still a lot more to come from this group of young men as they head into a Connacht Final and I encourage you all to dream big and who knows where we might go.

It was a competitive year all round for the underage boys and girls with an emphasis on fun and basic skill development for our younger children. The boy's underage format changed from 'even' age to 'odd' age grade with the U17 boys playing in division A of the Minor County Championship where they were runners-up in the final to neighbours, Westport. This is the first time a Minor team from the club have competed in division A and it is a testament to the ability and commitment of the players and all the coaches who over the years have put so much work and time into developing such a fine team. This group of boys then went on to complete their season when they were crowned the West Mayo U18B champions defeating Parke Kellogues Crimlin in the final played in Ballyheane.

We had 125 boys and girls take part in the Kellogg's Cúl Camp which took place during the week 26th of July. Our U15 boys and girls played in their respective John West Féile competitions, both reaching the semi-final.

Our ladies club continues to grow. It is great to see our girls competing at the business end of competitions. Our U16 girls reached the league final. After a year of not having a senior ladies' team I was delighted to see this. With a new and enthusiastic management team the ladies set to work which saw them as runners-up in League and Championship competitions. This experience bodes well for them and I am sure that there will be silverware in the not-too-distant future.

It is wonderful to see the hard work, commitment and dedication our managers and coaches have and I want to thank them all. As a club we find ourselves in an exciting place, but we must not get complacent. We need to capitalise on this and strive to continually improve and challenge ourselves to be better. We need to do the basic things right and we need to support each other and develop a club culture of positivity and enjoyment for all. We need to continue to be proactive in our approach to identifying new families in the parish and introducing them to the club.

It is always a dream for any player to play with their county and I want to congratulate all those who represented the club at various grades. Jack Carney with the Mayo U20s and Senior team, Liam Moore (Minor), Rian Kilcoyne, Conor Feehan, Conor Kelly and Conall Gill (U16) and Luke Durkan (U15). It is a proud moment to see one of our own wearing the County colours. Well done to you all.

The financing of a club at any time is a challenge. The club Finance Committee, under the guidance of the Treasurer, have worked hard to ensure that we are properly financed and can cover club running costs. The 'Ball on the Wall' fundraiser has been incredibly positive during the year. The granite plaques have been erected and additional pieces will be erected next year. The fundraiser is ongoing and can be signed up to at any stage. This is an investment in the future of the club and that of our children and grandchildren. Our

club lotto remains an important part of fundraising and is one of the primary ways we have of keeping the day-to-day bills paid. Thank you to all those in the parish who consistently play our lotto and to Margaret Duffy in Kilmeena Post Office for selling tickets.

Thank you to Councillor's Brendan Mulroy and John O'Malley who both contributed €5,000 to the club. Brendan also very kindly sponsored a set of gear for the U15 boys. There was a remarkably successful 'Hit the Hill' virtual 5km fundraiser co-ordinated by Carlene Gildea, Noreen Johnston and John Reilly.

After some years it was great to see the return of the Local League for boys and girls aged 9 to 13 years and to see the Healthy Club Committee run a series of fun activities in parallel with the League. This is something that I would like to see further developed next year. I would like to thank the Gibbons, Quinn, Ryan, Kelly, Mulloy and Fahy families for donating cups, attending presentations and supporting the club over many years.

In July, with the help of Julie Moore and Eimear O'Connell, a GAA Social Rounders Club was founded. This initiative has proved very successful attracting people who would not have previously been active in the club. Thank you to everyone involved and continued success going forward.

I would like to say a big thank you to the Health & Wellbeing Committee. They have worked tirelessly over the last year at promoting health and wellbeing information, health-related events and online webinars. It was a proud day for the club to receive official recognition as a 'GAA Healthy Club'.

At the beginning of the year, the club submitted an application for a new round of Sports Capital Funding and if successful it is planned to replace the ball netting and install new dugouts. As part of the current three-year plan, it is also the club's intention in 2022 to erect lights on the new training pitch to help further enhance our facilities.

I would like to recognise and say thank you to those who work on this wonderful publication. A special word of thanks to Martin McIntyre who is taking a step back and in doing so is handing over the reins to Michael O'Grady who I am confident will put his own unique stamp on this excellent publication over the coming years.

To those people who helped in any way at all around the club during the year, you know who you are, thank you very much!

On behalf of the club, I would like to extend sympathy to the families of those in the community who passed away in the last 12 months. We remember the family of Fr. Pat O'Brien P.P of Caherlistrane, Co. Galway who was curate in our parish in the 1990's. May his soul and the souls of all the departed rest in peace. The County Final, against Crossmolina, took place on Friday 29th October under lights in Mulvey Park, Castlebar. From a position of parity both at half

time and as the contest entered the final 15 minutes, the final loss (3 - 7 to 4 - 10) was very disappointing for Kilmeena. On the night, Crossmolina were the better side. However, the Kilmeena lads can be very proud of their achievement in reaching a County Final and one which on another day, they may well have came out on top, had their efforts not been blighted by injured personnel. With this abundance of talented and enthusiastic young men, the future is bright for Kilmeena GAA.

Seniors

This winter the Peter McDermott Cup will reside on the shores of Clew Bay nestled among the drumlins of the Kilmeena parish. This famous trophy made its last visit here in 2002, and there has been a yearning to have it back here ever since the club returned to junior ranks a decade ago.

There has been much expectation over the past few years that this group of players would deliver on that dream, but many of the current crop of players would be the first to acknowledge the work of those teammates that went before them in bringing the club to this stage. The year began when Covid restrictions were lifted in May and collective training could begin. From the outset the focus was clear – get back to a county final and use the experience of last year to go one step further.

Early Season

The season began with a flurry of early-season competitions. First up was the Kelly Cup and the West Mayo Junior B Championship. The Kelly Cup campaign saw us off to a good start with good wins over Achill and Tourmakeady, and a hard-fought tussle with Islandeady, which ended in a share of the spoils. Qualification to the knockout stage was denied on points difference.

In the West Mayo Junior B, our second string competed well against strong teams. We lost to Breaffy by the narrowest of margins, then defeated a strong Westport team before ending the campaign with a loss against a Balla team studded with players from Senior ranks.

Our B team had one outing in the County Junior C Championship, which involved a mid-summer trip up to Cill Chomáin. Although we lost comprehensively, it was a good day out, and little did we know, we would be locking horns with them on a much bigger stage later in the year.

In July, we competed in the Michael Walsh Junior League. Wins over Tourmakeady and Ballycroy looked to have set us up for further progress in the competition, but we were stunned at home by Eastern Gaels, who brought more dynamism and speed of thought on the day to edge us out, and ensure their own advancement to the latter stages.

League Campaigns and Cusack Cup

The league for both our A and B teams started in early August. We were able to integrate most of the successful minor squad into our B team for this campaign, and it was particularly pleasing to see these young men flourish in the early stages of their adult football careers. We started with two very narrow losses to Islandeady and Westport, but in the next game gained a very creditable draw against Castlebar, and then went on to defeat Balla comprehensively in our final League game.

For the first team, the month of August proved to be particularly difficult and ultimately a season-defining few weeks. We started off with a narrow home defeat to Parke, and on our next outing lost by a big margin in Balla. Next we headed off to Ballyhaunis hoping to get some league points on the board but our hopes were dashed by a stronger performance on the day from the East Mayo men.

Next up was the Cusack Cup Final in Newport against Achill. Surely this would be the game to stop the recent losing streak? An under-par performance saw us failing to retain the trophy, but more importantly, the question was could this group of players respond to turn their season around?

Potential relegation to Division 4 was a distinct possibility. Ardagh came to St. Brendan's Park in a must-win game for both teams. Our boys found their form and ran out easy winners. They backed this up a week later with an early scoring blitz in Bonniconlon to secure Division 3 status for another year.

Junior Championship Campaign

In our opening game, we hosted Tourmakeady on a pleasant late September evening, and after a bright opening, ran out facile winners on a score of 4-11 to 0-4.

Next up was a trip to Kilfian, and on a wet and breezy day in North Mayo, we once again ran up a big score to win out by 3-18 to 0-3.

The group decider was against Ardagh in Newport, and despite our league victory a few weeks earlier, we were prepared for a real battle, and so it proved. Our physicality and sheer hard work saw us prevail by 1-14 to 0-8.

With no time to rest on our laurels, we met Killala on a wet and windy day in Parke. We struggled to impose our game on Killala who had set up very defensively and it was the final quarter before we really imposed ourselves on the game, but once again won by a wide margin of 1-12 to 1-3.

When we were drawn against Islandeady for the semi-finals, there was much talk of the big two meeting head on. There was no doubt that we were prepared for our stiffest challenge of the season. The early exchanges saw us creating a number of chances which we failed to take and the three-point margin at half time didn't fully reflect our superiority. The third quarter saw the team really demonstrating their defensive and attacking prowess, which saw the platform set for a 1-19 to 0-6 victory.

County Final

The team had now scaled the heights of last year, but this time they were not to be denied their march to the summit. We came up against an excellently organised Cill Chomáin team, and on the day we needed big performances from key players, which they duly delivered on. Much already has been written about the heroes on the day, but a number of moments will live long in the memory.

It might be Mossy Gill's block on the line, it could well be Stephen Staunton's altercation with his opposite number or ultimately it might be Seanie Ryder's tackle which set up his goal. Whatever it is, this group of players deserve to look back on their achievements because of the sheer hard work they put in all year.

They now look forward to a Connacht campaign and Intermediate football in 2022. As Seanie Ryder, our captain stated euphorically when he lifted the Peter McDermott cup, "this is only the start boys, it's only the start".

Thankfully, following physio and rehab, Jack was able to play his part in the latter knock-out stages of Kilmeena's march to the County Junior title.

While everyone in the club looks forward with eager anticipation to 2022 and what that may bring, Jack will stay true to his belief in being present in the here and now. Whatever 2022 brings in terms of County participation, he will only focus for now on Kilmeena. And if that is good enough to bring him into the Mayo panel again next year, then so be it.

The GAA and LGFA have agreed a number of Child Safeguarding initiatives and policies to ensure the safety of children while playing our games. The adoption of such agreed documents alone will not achieve this aim. The continuous commitment and implementation of such good practices by dedicated volunteers in our club with the support and vigilance of our parents assist us to create a safe environment for young people in which to grow and develop.

The agreed procedures require that all coaches of underage players must undertake Garda vetting, attend regular Gaelic games safeguarding and have a

coaching qualification relevant to their role. The club is required to maintain and update regularly a compliance register of all volunteers.

Our policies and procedures are in accordance with current legislative requirements and include:

- The publication of a Child Safeguarding Statement
- Carrying out an annual Risk Assessment procedure in our club
- A Code of Behaviour for Underage which includes: recruitment policy for those working with children, child

- safeguarding training requirements, anti-bullying statement and social media policy.
- Guidance for dealing and reporting allegations or concerns of abuse
- Appointing Children's Officers and Designated Liaison Persons in our club

As our club is growing year on year we encourage others to take on the above roles to ensure the continued safety of our children while participating in our activities.

Community Person of the Year Award

On August 9th 2021, Fr. Jim Walsh and Fr Charlie McDonnell blessed the newly laid pitch surface at St Brendan's Park.

After the blessing, the Club presented both men with the 'Community Person of the Year' award in recognition of everything they have done and continue to do for our community and parish.

This was especially evident over recent times when despite the challenges of Covid-19, they continued to provide the sacraments, support young and old alike and keep our spirits lifted, for which we are all very grateful.
